
FOR THE RECORD... The controls on our new Bridgeport Milling Machine — pictured in last week's issue — are manufactured by our very own **Balcrank** division.


A TIMELY TIP . . . You can fool some people all of the time. You can fool all people some of the time. **But** don't fool yourself any of the time.




