

Internal cleaning and deburring of hydraulic valve and pump castings is being performed by a recently installed Wheelabrator OCFM (Orboresonant Cleaning and Finishing Machine) at Borg-Warner Corporation, Hydraulics Division, Wooster, Ohio.

The OCFM operates by submerging the work to be cleaned in an abrasive media mass. Work energy is created by oscillating a special beam, with the fixtured work attached, at its natural resonant frequency. The abrasive media will flow into internal passages and blind areas that cannot be reached by conventional methods.

Borg-Warner is reporting excellent results with a reduction in cleaning costs and cleaning time cycles. (Wheel-abrator-Frye is currently the only manufacturer producing a machine that operates on the orboresonant principle.)
