

Remember Operation Navy? Teamwork got that job done. Teamwork will do the job again.



PROFIT IMPROVEMENT... The second phase of a three-phase program to reduce the cost of manufacturing Balcrank revolving handles has been implemented. The installation of fixtures for a more productive assembly of the handles has been completed and is now in operation.

The project, headed by Senior Process Engineer **Oakley Campbell**, incorporates many of his design and assembly ideas. Production runs made on the fixture indicate the predicted cost savings of an estimated \$12,000 annually and an increase in production of at least 25 percent.
