RESCO IS TAKING SHAPE

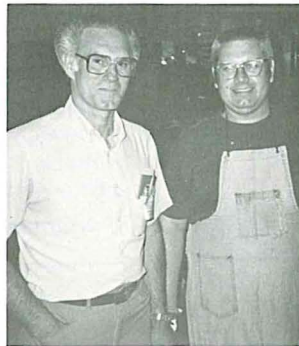
Thanks to a real team effort, we have been able to land a sizeable order to provide parts for a Refuse to Energy Facility being built in Millbury, MA. This order represents a year's

CAD/CAM BECOMES OPERATIONAL AT WHEELABRATOR

The term CAD/CAM refers to Computer Aided Design and Computer Aided Manufacturing. It's a state of the art engineering system that allows our designers and engineers to develop extremely accurate, consistent, and high quality drawings and designs in a minimal amount of time.

Since our system became operational January 15, 1986, twelve of our employees have undergone extensive training in the use of the new equipment. They are:

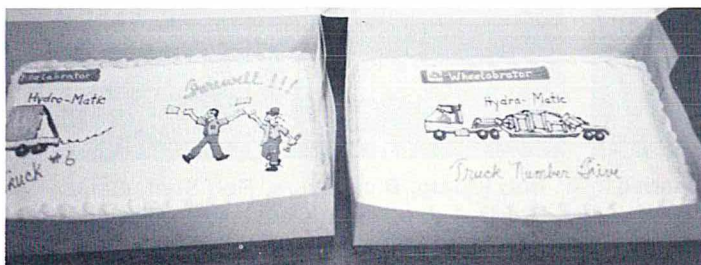
FAREWELL CELEBRATION FOR THE HYDRAMATIC

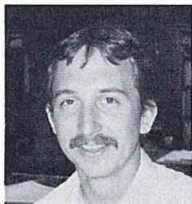

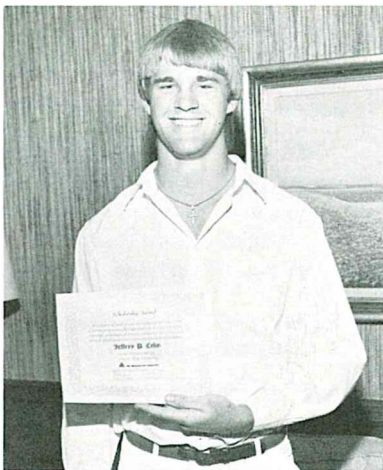

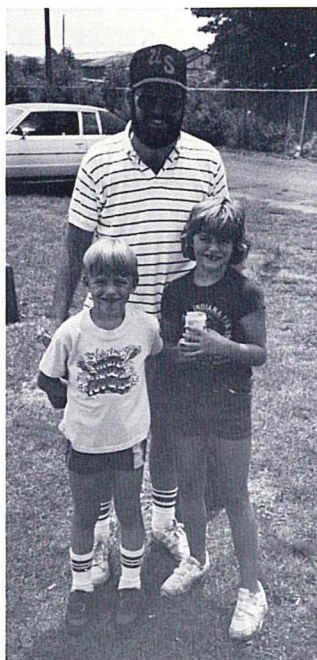


Softball Tournament
