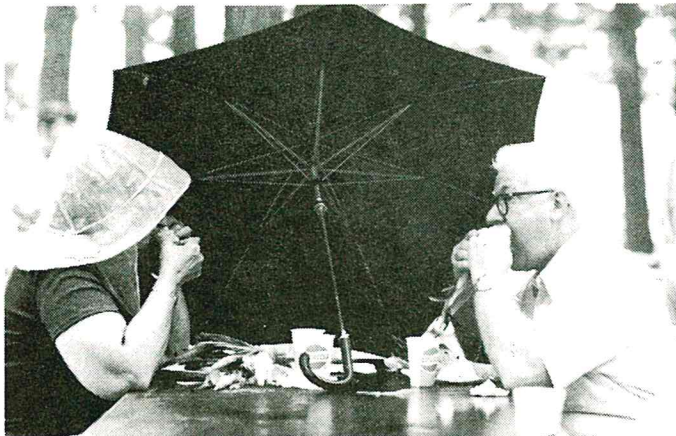

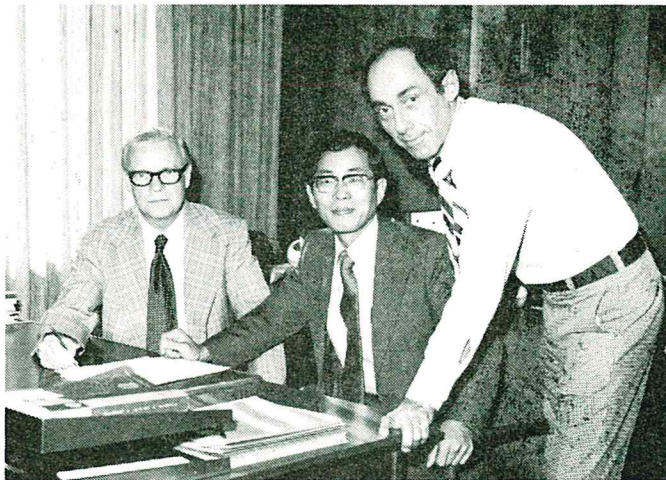

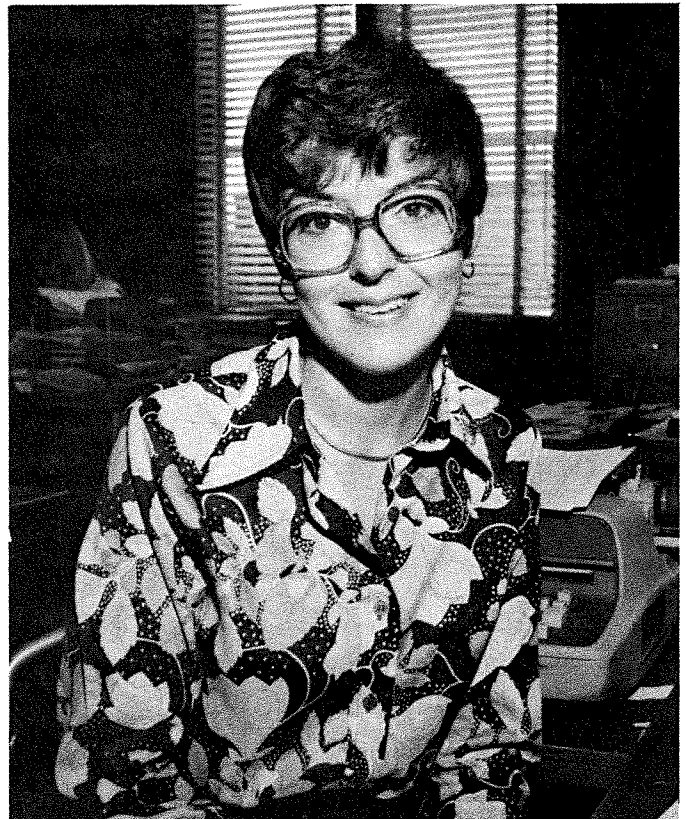
TWILIGHT GOLFERS — Contact Larry Baker (ext. 429) for reservations for Outing to be held Saturday, September 17.
