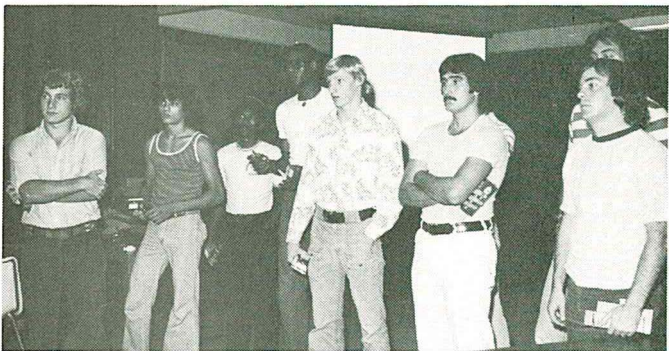

At the Julianna Club luncheon, Mary (l) and Mary Lou Rethlake (r), President-Julianna Club, smile for our photographer.



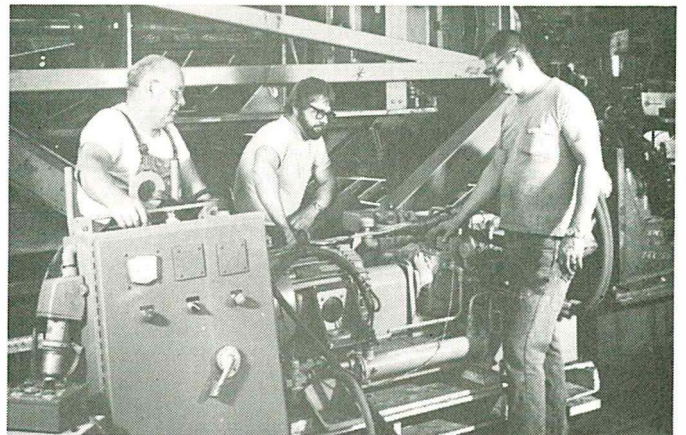

Shipped to Pontiac Motor Division, G.M.C., last week was this Wheelabrator Ram Tunnel Blast Machine. It will be used to clean automotive head castings at the rate of 1200 per hour — that's one casting every three seconds. The heads are automatically loaded onto a loading conveyor (right foreground) and then rammed into the blast tunnel. The abrasive blast from nine blast wheels removes all the molding sand.

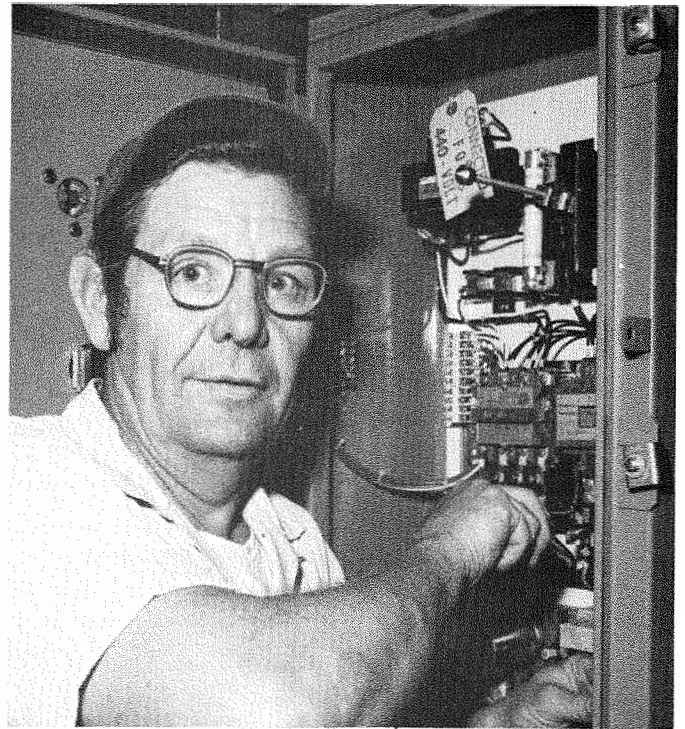
