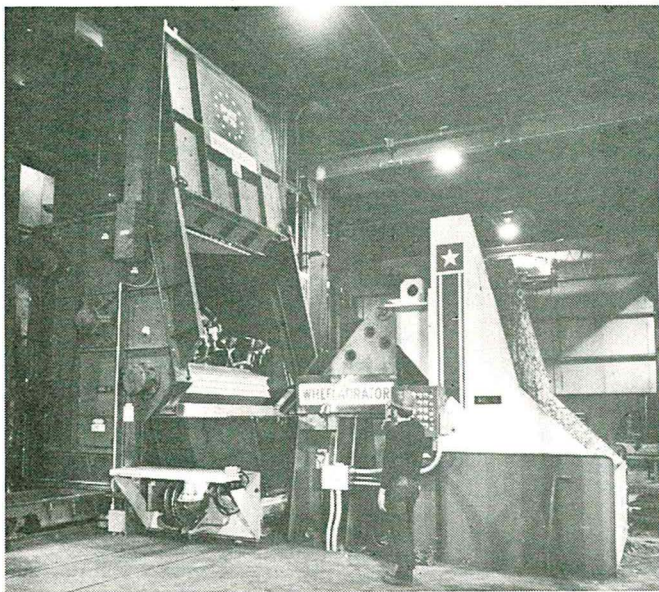

The technique uses metal panels, covered with asphalt. For better bonding, a BLASTRAC is surface preparing approximately 105,000 sq. ft. of these metal panels prior to pouring the asphalt.
