## REFUSE-TO-ENERGY . . .

Reprinted from the publication of the IUE-AFL-CIO Local 201, General Electric Company, Lynn, Massachusetts: "RESCO, the Refuse Energy Systems Company (WFI's facility), located across the Saugus River, provides 50 per cent of the steam used at the River Works plant. RESCO solves two problems at the same time . . . conservation of fossil fuel and disposal of refuse. RESCO has cut G.E.'s yearly consumption of fuel oil by 10 to 12 million gallons. RESCO has also provided over 1 million dollars in revenue to the town of Saugus. Conservation of fuel oil is crucial for economic stability, a lessening of dependence on foreign imported oil, and future availability. Energy is by and large democratic stability. Concerned employees should contact their senators and congressmen to look into the push for similar type plants across the country."

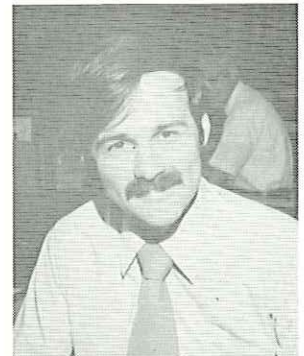

Also celebrating number 30 — birthday, that is — was Larry Huemmer, Regional Supply Supervisor - Parts Sales.



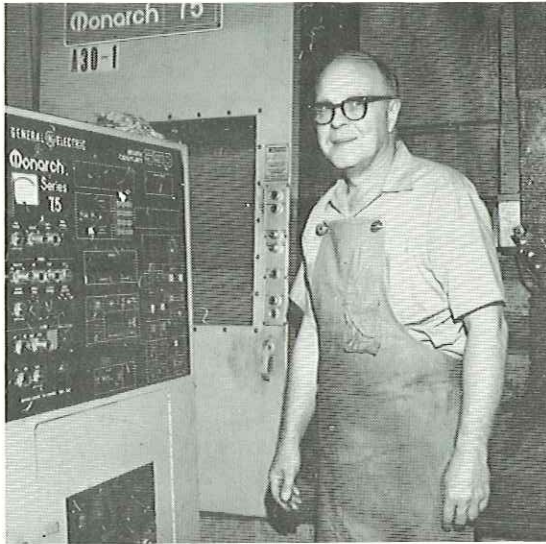
## MAX STANGER — 30 YEAR MAN . . .
