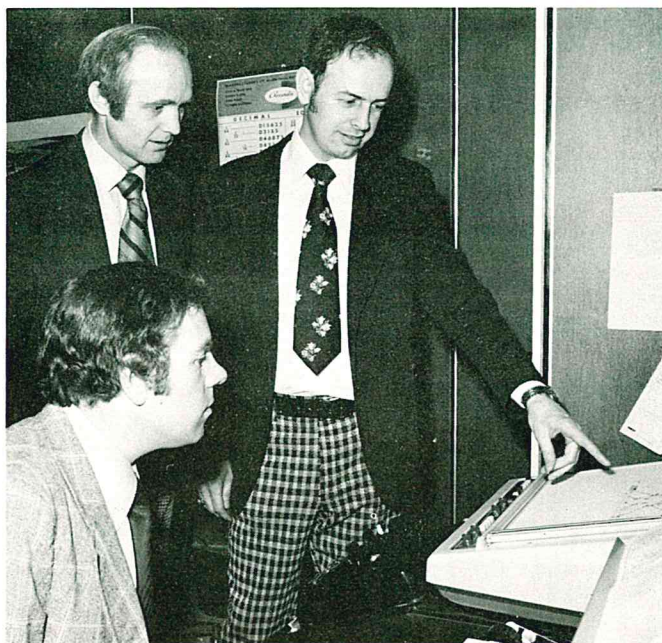

OUR CONTINUED COOPERATION IS NEEDED . . . We have been advised by I&M that they expect to be down to a 40-day stockpile of coal by this weekend. According to State Public Service Commission orders, commercial and industrial customers are required to curtail consumption by 25%, with possible additional mandatory curtailments when the stockpile reaches a 30-day supply.

In response to this mandate, the Company will achieve the necessary reduction by shutting down the arc furnaces in Plant II on one shift each day. The Company will make every effort to utilize the affected employees on other jobs.

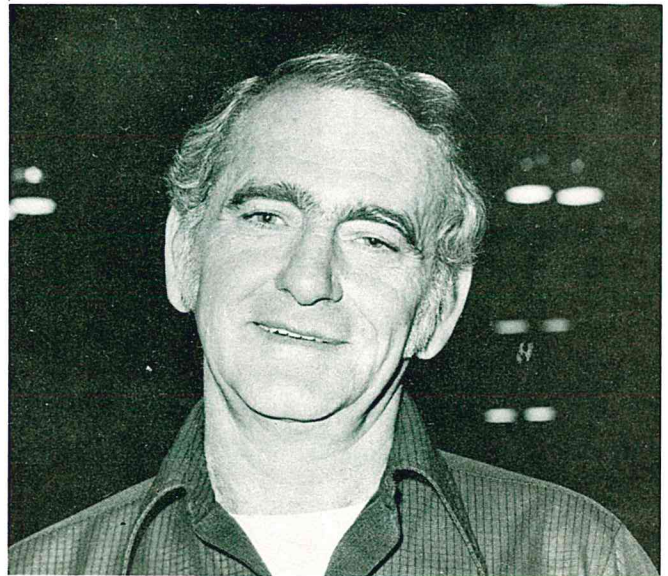
All employees who recently transferred temporarily to Plant II should report to their regular jobs on their usual shifts, starting with the third shift Sunday, February 26.

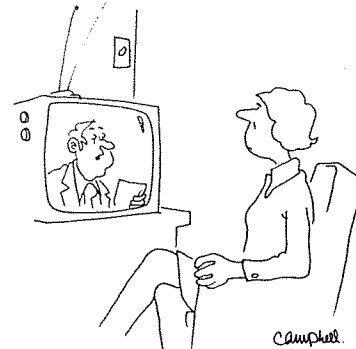
