The first official observance of Memorial Day was conducted by the Grand Army at Arlington National Cemetery in 1868; however, it was not until years later that the individual states declared Memorial Day a legal holiday. Today, Memorial Day always falls on the last Monday in May.




IN THE SWING OF THINGS . . .
