MCSD hosted a group of representatives from Armstrong Products, Warsaw, Indiana, one of the leading manufac-




turers of the epoxy coating powder, to acquaint them with centrifugal blast cleaning processes — all rebar must be blast cleaned prior to coating.

CIRCLON VIBRATORY FINISHING MACHINES...




