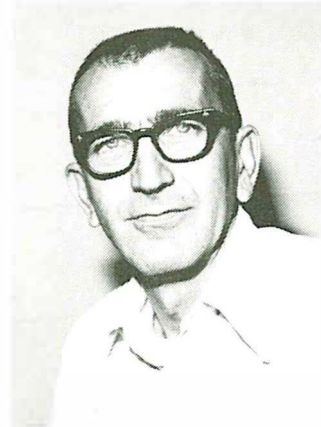

The reason for this dramatic change has been increased productivity. Farmers were willing to change to new methods and machines. The result was greater productivity and a better life for everyone.

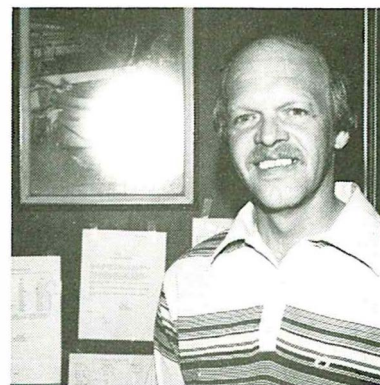
35-YEAR MAN . . .



Congratulations to **BOB KLUMP**, Machine Shop Foreman, who hit the 35-year mark on Wednesday.

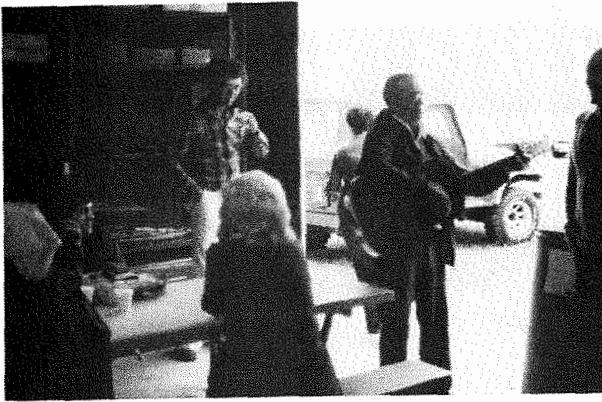

EDWARD VOORDE, JR., was named April "Melter of the Month." Ed is a first shift Melter with over 15 years of company service. Congratulations, Ed!

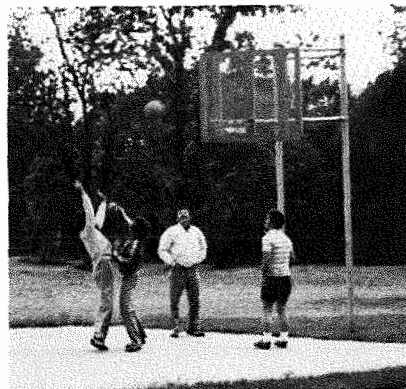

Assembly personnel and their families gathered last Sunday for an honest-to-goodness Hog Roast — 250 pounds of eating!

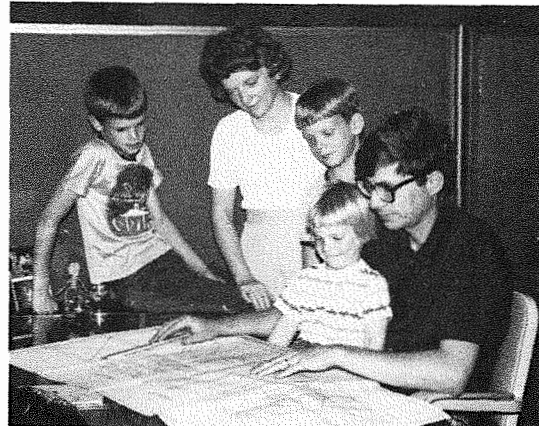


Duane Drake and Everett Buss coordinated the event, ably assisted by Bob Watts and Neal Soule (Foundry co-worker).

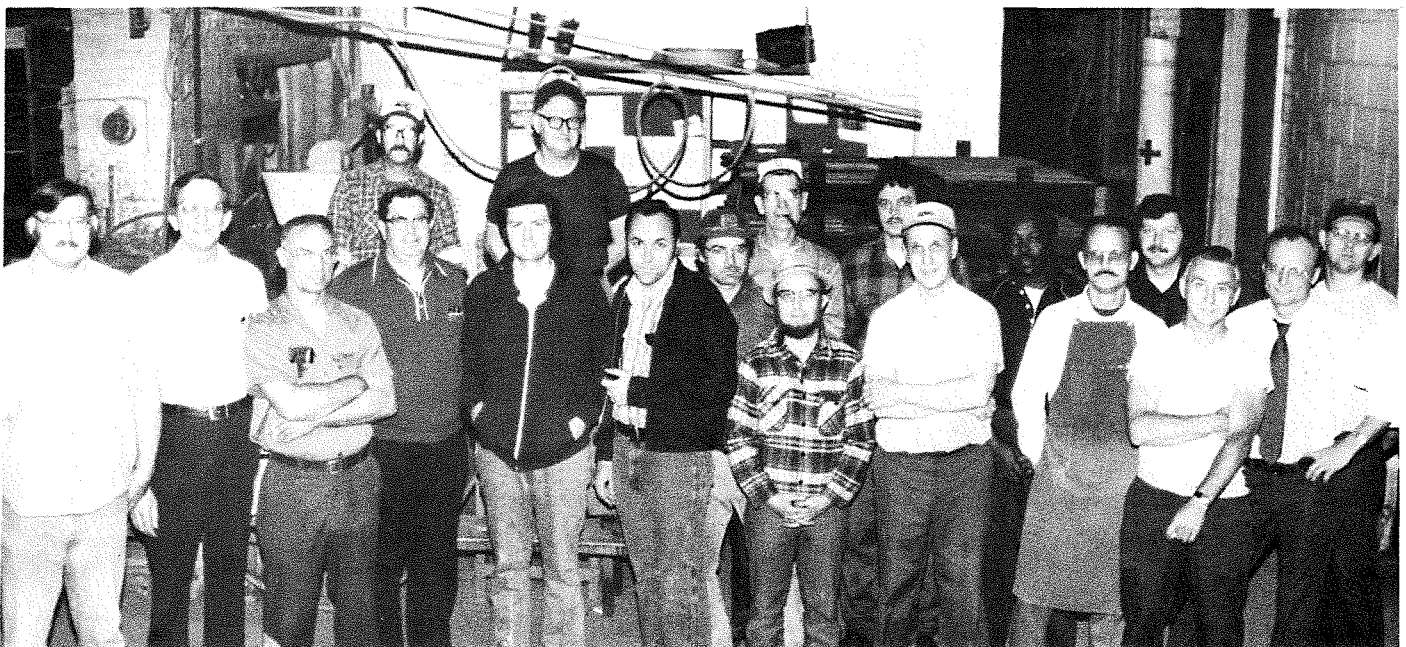
