This goodwill is particularly stressed during the holiday season. And rightly so. It is seen in the spirit of Christmas giving and the warmth of family and friend relationships.


While we prepare to enter the festive holiday celebrations, let us feel the glow that comes from having marked the true spirit of Christmas, not only this month, but during the whole year.
