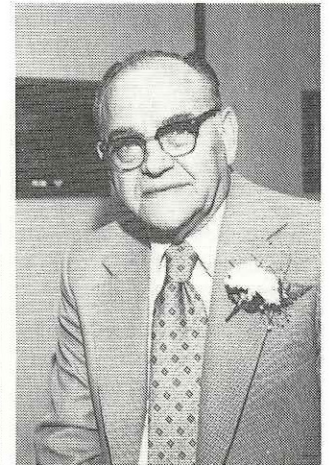

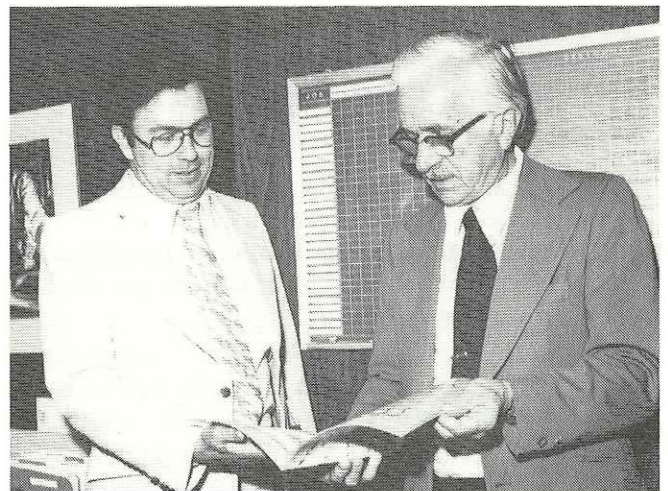

THE ARGUMENT is made that cutting capital gains taxes only helps the rich. Nothing could be further from the truth. High capital gains taxes discourage people from investing in business, especially in new businesses. That means fewer jobs available.

Capital gains taxes were doubled in 1969 from a maximum tax of 25% to 50%. Since that time, it is estimated that 6,000,000 small investors have dropped out of the capital markets.

Last year Congress reversed itself somewhat by shaving a bit off the capital gains tax. But it isn't enough. The Germans, Japanese, French, Italians, Swiss and most other Western people pay virtually no capital gains taxes whatsoever. Why not give enterprising people a chance once again to go into business for themselves and at least go back to pre-1970 rates? It's been estimated that doing so would create 306,000 new jobs by 1982.
