

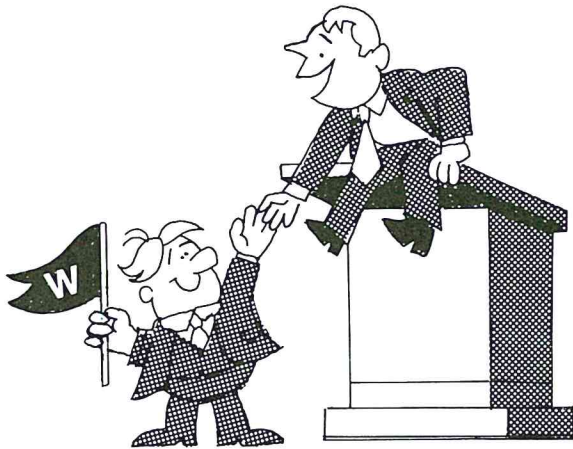

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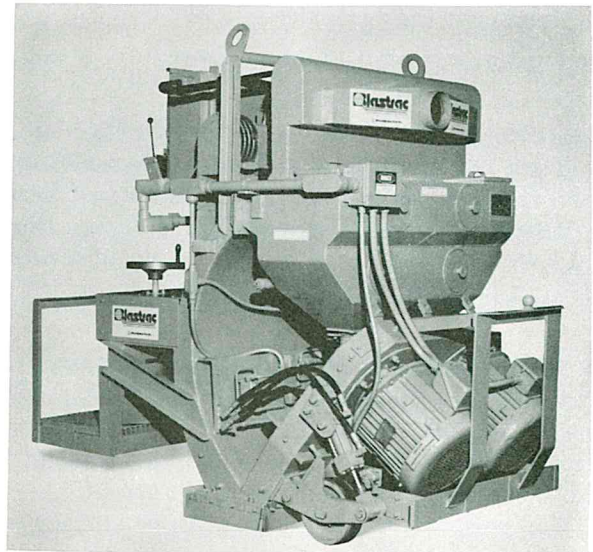


REMINDER TO EMPLOYEES SIGNED UP FOR THE TOASTMASTERS PROGRAM

Your donation will be greatly appreciated.

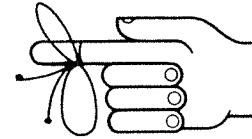
