Sales in 1979 were \$946,923,000, an increase of 21% over 1978 sales and net income was \$42,675,000, up 15% over the preceding year.

Mr. Dingman also said that Wheelabrator-Frye's financial condition and operations continued strong. He commented that, barring a serious deterioration of the economic environment, he expected 1980 to be another highly successful year for the company.
