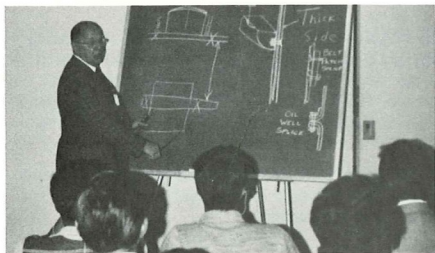

Troubleshooter **Bruce Berger** shares his knowledge with the Mexican attendees.

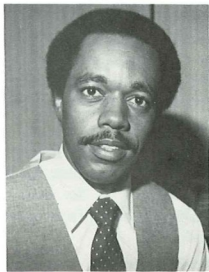
PROFESSOR LELIAERT, IF YOU PLEASE . . .

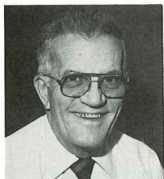
