# PROFIT ... HERE'S WHERE IT GOES! BACK TO US!

Over \$191,000 is being spent to install and outfit five Employee Centers. Four of the five Centers are already completed and are strategically located throughout the factory for the convenience of employees, as well as being air conditioned for comfort during the warm summer months. The fifth Center will be located on the second floor of the main office building.

Every effort is being made to make these areas a real plus to improve our work environment — vending machines to include hot and cold food and drinks, microwave ovens, and change-making machines. In the Centers located in the factory, shelves will be available for storing lunches in these cool, clean areas. (Cigarette machines will be located outside the areas for easy access during the workday.)

Installation of the shop Centers coincides with the program of regular rest and lunch periods as outlined in last September's labor agreement — times which have been determined by an employee survey.

The new concept is expected to improve overall productivity. Maintaining top productivity is an obligation we all have at all times but even more so during the current economic climate — our jobs may depend on it! It's up to all of us — including our visitors and customers — to observe the new shop rules. In particular, the fact that the partaking of food and beverages will not be permitted in the plant except for the first ten minutes of each shift, during the two break periods, and the lunch period.

The shop Centers were in service this week. This is a shakedown period to make sure the equipment is in proper working order. The new rest period and lunch schedule will go into effect August 3.

In the care of our Centers, we will follow the McDonald's concept and pick up after ourselves. When the Centers are not in use, the vending company will stock the machines and clean the tables and chairs. Our Maintenance Department will do heavy cleaning such as floors.

Like many successful changes, a cooperative attitude will be required. Our new Employee Centers may well represent a major change created through a cooperative labor and management atmosphere.
