NEW TELEPHONE SYSTEM — CHOCK-FULL OF EFFICIENT FEATURES . . .

Recently, for any employee working after five, it has not been unusual to hear phones ringing throughout the various offices and Ma Bell's work crew answering, "This station is located in the northwest corner, second floor (or wherever the area might be)." All this extra telephone activity is necessary to the installation of a new telephone system which will go into effect **Saturday, December 5**. Some of the features available in the new system include:

CALL PICKUP

Need to answer a co-worker's phone?
Don't leave your desk — use call pickup.

CALL FORWARDING — ALL CALLS

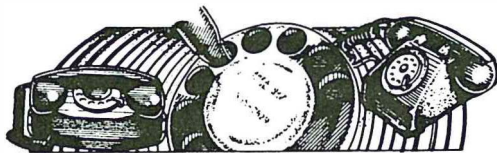
Out of the office but you don't want to miss your calls?
Forward your calls to another phone.

AUTOMATIC CALLBACK

Tired of trying to reach a busy co-worker over and over?
Let the system call you back when your co-worker gets off the phone.

THREE-WAY CALL

Need to set up a small telephone conference quickly?



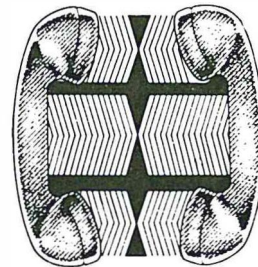
CALL WAITING — ORIGINATING

Want to let a busy extension know you're trying to get through?

Send a signal!

CALL FORWARDING BUSY AND DON'T ANSWER

Want your calls answered even when you're on the phone?
Forward your calls to another telephone.



CALL HOLD

Ever need to look up information while you have someone on your line?
Put the call on hold while you get the information.

Employees having daily telephone contact will be scheduled for training classes beginning the week of November 30. A Telephone Counselor will contact these employees as to where and when.

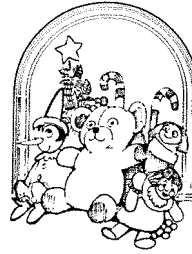
November 21 **Junior Achievement Trade Fair.** The two and Wheelabrator sponsored J.A. companies
