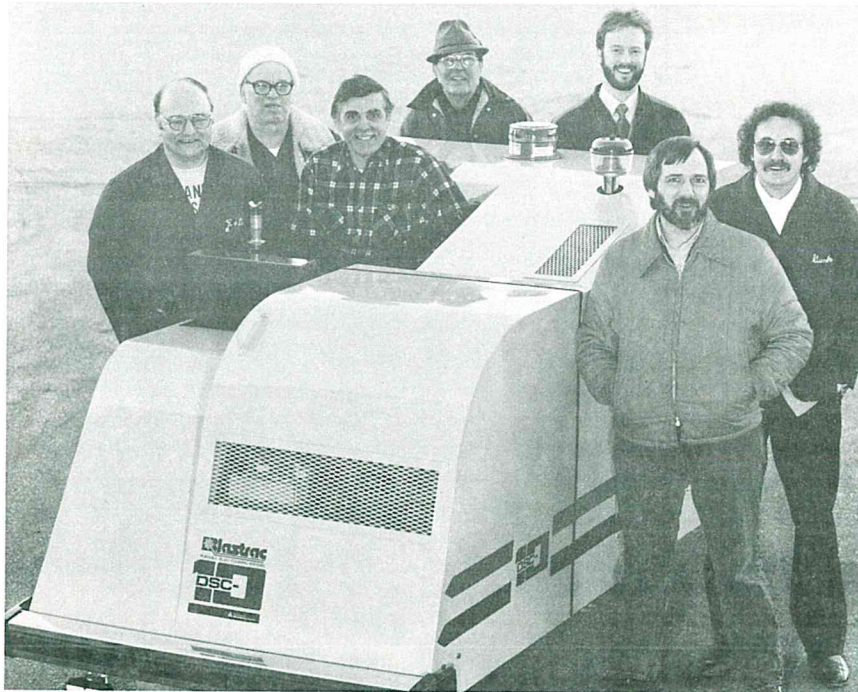

The DSC-10, a diesel powered self-contained portable unit is designed to be used in large open areas and remote outdoor locations where electric power is not readily available. In combination with other existing Blastrac electric powered models, the DSC-10 helps to provide Blastrac with the most complete product line in the portable blast equipment industry.

Stepping down after a very successful year of activities are the Club's officers for 1984.



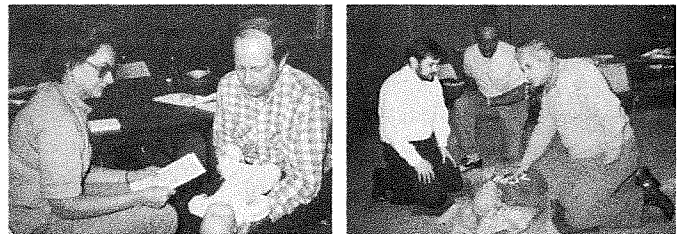

A get-together was also held for **Jewel Bradberry** ▼ in the Assembly area.

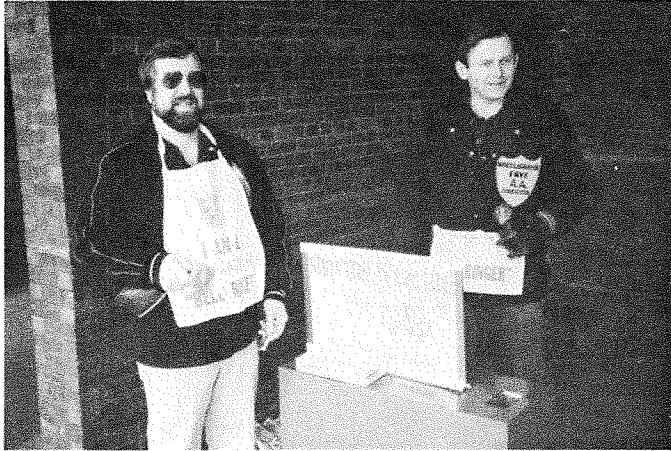
