OUR TWO-DIVISION CONCEPT CONTINUES TO TAKE SHAPE

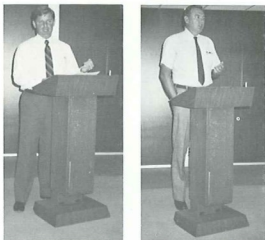
Earlier this year, we announced the formation of our 2-division concept here at Wheelabrator.

United Way Agencies Need Our Help!



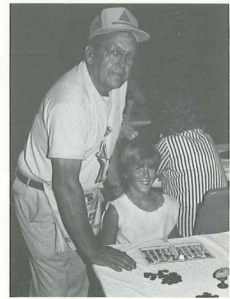

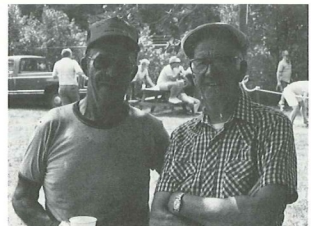
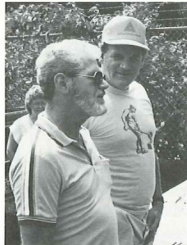
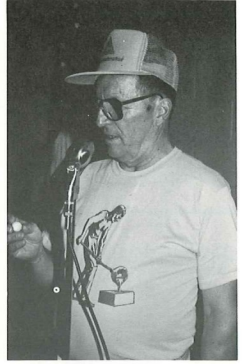
The 1986 St. Joseph County United Way Drive needs to raise \$3,165,000 to support 37 very worthwhile area social services agencies.
